

When Must You Verify Age to Sell Tobacco Products?

The Federal Drug Administration (FDA) says you must **CHECK PHOTO IDENTIFICATION** of everyone, every time, who appears under the age of 30 who attempts to purchase any tobacco product(s). If you are unsure, **ASK FOR ID** anyway!

Even if you know the customer personally, and know they are old enough, and even if you checked their ID yesterday, **CHECK ID again!**

If an ***Undercover Inspection*** is happening today, you will be seen violating Tobacco 21 Law if you do not ask for the customer's photo ID.



Acceptable Forms of Photo Identification



State

- A valid state driver's license, state identification card, permanent resident card, military identification card, passport, immigration card, or a valid tribal identification card which shows the person is 21 years of age or older.

Federal

- Unless otherwise required by state or local law, FDA recommends retailers accept only government-issued photographic identification with the bearer's date of birth. (i.e., State-issued driver's license or identification card, military identification card, passport or immigration card) for establishing a legal age to purchase FDA regulated products.

NOTE: AN EXPIRED CARD IS NOT ACCEPTABLE!

ID Check Yes on 3

Sometimes it can be confusing what you should be looking for when you ask for someone's ID. So, just remember this....

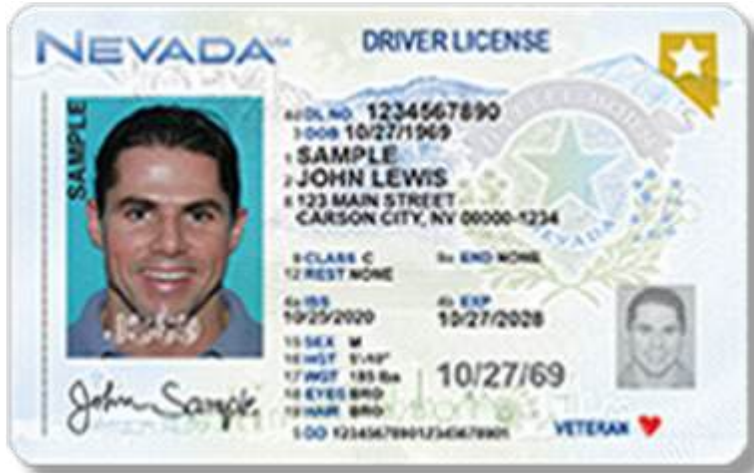
ID CHECK YES ON 3

- 1. PHOTO-** Does the photo match the person in front of you?
- 2. DATE OF BIRTH-** Can you verify the person is at least 21 years of age?
- 3. EXPIRATION DATE-** Is the ID valid?

If you can answer YES to all 3, proceed with the sale. If not, refuse the sale due to the NO.



NEW Nevada CARD



The new Nevada card design features the Battle Born insignia and the statehood year of 1864 complemented by a photo of the Sierra Nevada and the Las Vegas skyline. On the back is the Carson City skyline and the Playa in the Black Rock Desert.

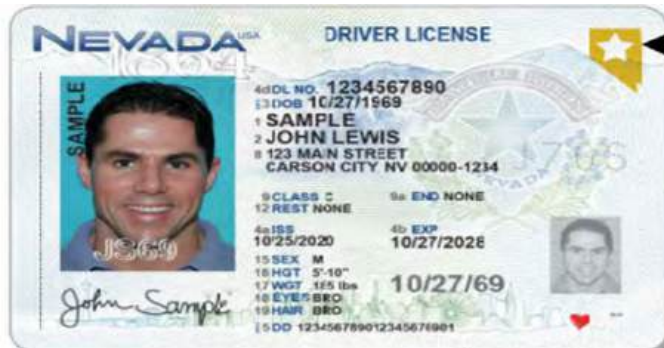
The cards have numerous upgraded security features including a ghost photo, a laser engraving of the holder's initials and birth year and a restated date of birth with a raised feel.

[Real ID](#) compliant cards show a gold Nevada outline with a star cut out. Standard cards are marked "NOT FOR REAL ID PURPOSES" and Driver Authorization Cards are marked "NOT VALID FOR ID." Cards are marked "LIMITED TERM" just below the Real ID indicator when immigration documents are used for proof of identity.

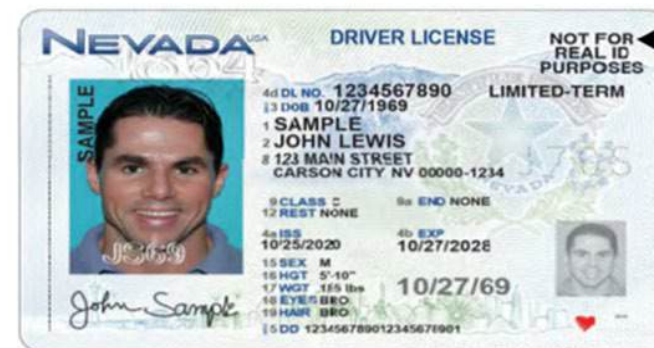
All Nevada cards issued September 1, 2021 or later feature the new design.

MAJOR DIFFERENCES

- The Nevada titling will now be at the top left of the card.
- Card type will be displayed at the top of the card.
- The validity marker of the card (Real ID star or Not for Real ID purposes) will be displayed at the top right of the card. Driver Authorization Cards are marked Not Valid for ID.
- The New DL/ID background color will fade from Blue to Green and back to Blue across the face of the card.
- Various card design elements have changed.
- Order of card data has changed. In order from top to bottom, left to right, DL# is not at the top, whether the card is limited term, followed by Date of Birth (DOB), Name, Address, DL class, DL Endorsements, DL Restrictions, Issue Date, Expiration Date, personal biometric data of the owner, lastly any indicators of organ donor, veteran status or other specific DL/ID markers.
- Perforation data now matches the owner's initial of the first name, the owners height in inches, and the initial of their last name (e.g. John Sample 5'-10" will be J70S).
- DOB will be restated on the card, next to the weight of the owner, with a raised feel for security purposes.
- There will be an indentation of the owner's initial of the first name, initial of their last name, and the last two digits of their birth year. (e.g. John Sample 1969 will be JS69) at the bottom of the portrait.

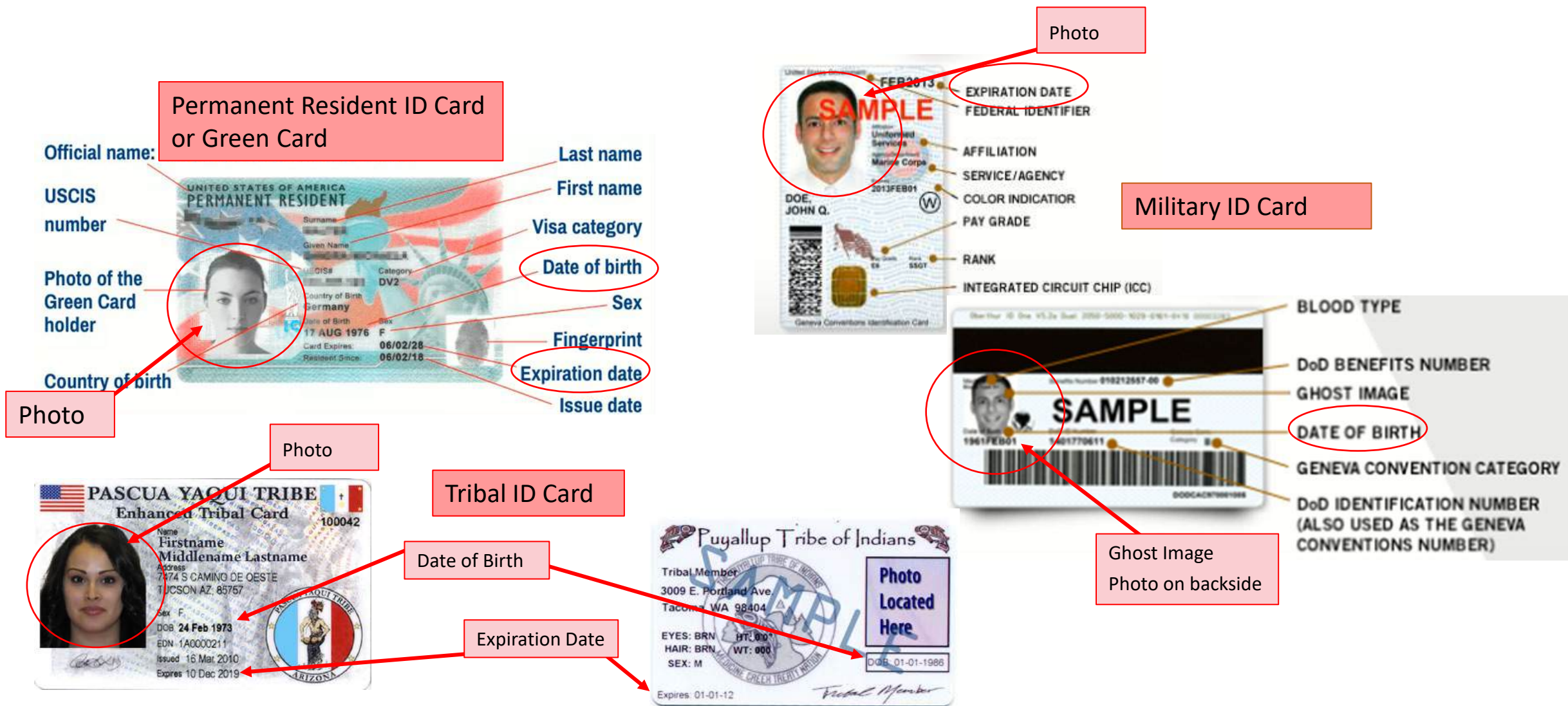
